From The Pastor's Desk....

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When I first wrote my newsletter article, we were preparing to return to our sanctuary for worship on Easter Sunday, April 4, for the first time since March 15, 2020, provided that the number of new COVID cases and the rate of positive test results remained within the safe zone. We were so looking forward to this that we continued with our Easter plans even when the numbers began to rise above our threshold positivity rate of 5%, hoping that the numbers would stabilize or go back down. Unfortunately, the rate has now risen to 6.5%. The number of daily new cases has also risen. At a special meeting of our planning committee and council on March 28 we therefore decided to postpone our return to the sanctuary until the COVID positivity rate for Carroll County returns to 5% or below. We will get word out to everyone as quickly as possible, especially to those who had indicated they were coming. By the time you receive this newsletter, you may have already been informed.

It has been well over a year since we had to leave the sanctuary, and I know that many of you, like me, are deeply disappointed and perhaps angry over this latest postponement. Especially when plans were already announced, and we were so close!!

Whether we celebrate in the sanctuary or on Zoom, the good news of Easter remains the same. Even when we are walking through the valley of the shadow of death for a very long time, death does not have the final word. The cross and the grave must give way to the empty tomb. Life emerges victorious: abundant life, overflowing life, eternal life! But in the meantime, we must live our Easter faith in a Good Friday world. And there's plenty of Good Friday to go around these days. My disappointment over the postponement seems so minor with over 562,000 COVID deaths in the U.S. along with many other loved ones we have lost in recent months. And now with the mass killings in Georgia and Colorado leaving us stunned and outraged. "It's Friday..." said African-American preacher S.M. Lockridge in one of his most powerful sermons. "It's Friday... but Sunday's coming!"

This will be my first Easter without Caroline, and it may be your first Easter without someone you have loved. For that reason, the good news of Jesus' victory over death will be especially powerful and meaningful for me this time around. I can hardly wait to hear and say the words: "The Lord is risen! He is risen indeed!" and "I know that my redeemer lives!"

While you continue to live in this Good Friday world, may you be sustained each day by the good news of Easter. Jesus lives! And because he lives, we shall live also!


STEPHEN MINISTRY

- * Steve Wingate from Re:MEMBER Church Directories attended a portion of the meeting.
 - Steve made a presentation to council and answered questions concerning an opportunity to update Immanuel's church directory. He explained the process with adherence to strict Co vid procedures. One photographer with mask comes to Immanuel. One family at a time with no salesmen. Company personnel handles all scheduling and sign ups. FOOD DISTRIBUTION MINISTRY REPORT

March 16th was the end of the 52nd week of our food distribution ministry, a full year of serving our neighbors in need with our community partners. In the past year we have distributed 5,395 bags of groceries, plus milk, eggs, produce, meat, snack bags, and other items as donated, representing 21,580 meals. Anniversaries are generally something to celebrate, but as Brenda, Pete, Carol, and I commented, there is sadness that there are still so many people who rely on us to put food on the table. At the same time, we are grateful that our ministry has grown in such wonderful ways. So many new relationships have formed among volunteers, guests, and the supporters of our ministry. We praise and thank God for His blessings upon our work, our benefactors, and the people we serve.

During the four-week period February 20 – March 16, our average weekly attendance was 94 individuals and families, 12 more than the previous four weeks.

In the past month we've instituted three initiatives:

- * In an endeavor to build relationships with our guests, we have been introducing ourselves by name and making an effort to learn and remember learn the names of some of our guests. This goal was the result of Hunger Coaching through the ELCA. We're also engaging in more conversation with our guests.
- * A donor log is now being used to keep better track of food pantry donations.
- * A leadership team meeting was held on March 2 and will continue the first Tuesday of the month after food distribution.

We're grateful for our faithful congregational support through service as volunteers; and the donations of milk money, grocery money, grocery items, plastic bags, and whatever need we make known. Thank you for your generosity and prayers during these still difficult days. ~Christine Crouch, Food Distribution Team
