From The Pastor's Desk....

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As I sit down to write this to you, we are two days away from my wife's first chemo treatment for what has now become stage 4 cancer. Her doctor told us that her cancer can no longer be cured but can be controlled and managed using a new way of targeting cancer cells and keeping them from growing. Because of Caroline's severe reaction to her previous chemotherapy, this is a scary time for us. We are praying that her body will tolerate this promising new treatment. By the time you read this, we will have a much better idea where we stand.

Just as with Caroline's cancer, we do not have a cure for the new coronavirus that has been ravaging our nation and our world now for almost 6 months, with no signs of abating. We can, however, control and manage its spread by the public health measures that have become so familiar to us: staying at home as much as possible, wearing face masks and social distancing in public, testing and isolating positive cases and tracing their contacts. While doing our best to manage the virus' spread, researchers around the world are hard at work developing vaccines that could stop the virus in its tracks.

Meanwhile, Christians and all people of faith are praying for those affected by the pandemic: praying for those infected, hospitalized, fighting for their lives; praying for those who have died and their grieving families; praying for dedicated and often exhausted doctors, nurses and healthcare workers; praying for vaccine researchers; praying for those who have lost jobs and businesses and may soon lose their homes to the pandemic; praying for local, county, state and national officials leading us through this unprecedented time; praying for each other to stand firm against the virus by maintaining those health measures when they become so tiresome.

Especially to those who do not share our faith, even the billions of prayers being offered up every day may seem pointless. Yet we persevere in prayer, trusting in God's many promises to hear and answer our prayers even when we see no results. Caroline and I can both testify that it was your persistent prayer support that got us through her battle to this point, and will continue to get us through whatever may come. So please do continue to pray for us, for each other, and for our community, our nation and our world. The Bible tells us in Luke 18:1 that Jesus wants us "to pray always and not to lose heart." In times like these it can be a challenge to live up to those words, especially the part about not losing heart. Remember that every single prayer offered up in faith does make a difference!

Remember also that I am praying for you every day. If there is anything you would like me to keep in mind as I pray for you, please let me know by any of the means listed below. I consider this one of the greatest privileges I enjoy as your pastor.

Keep the faith, and keep on praying!



The amazing thing is it was those very same neighborhood connections that we as a congregation together have made, outside our four walls, that has truly made this mission successful. And through this our "neighborhood" has expanded well beyond the town of Manchester to connecting with neighbors from far outside our town. How far can this reach? It will be a continued journey for all of us as we stay reminded that God is with us, always, we are strong together, and that our neighborhood has long arms. How far will we journey?...it is unlimited.

FOOD DISTRIBUTION REPORT AUGUST 2020

The month of July ushered in some changes and some challenges for our feeding ministry. Beginning the second week of July we dropped Thursdays as a distribution day, maintaining Tuesdays and Saturdays as our days to give out food. Tuesdays and Saturdays always had fresh produce available from Weis Market; Miller's Market; and on Tuesdays, Two Boots Farm. We have the Humane Society offering pet food and supplies at Immanuel every other Tuesday. Thursday became an "off day" with lower numbers and limited offerings. As our numbers are declining somewhat we decided to drop Thursdays, knowing we can always go back to three days/week should the need arise.

With challenges, blessings often come to light. In July Immanuel's kitchen refrigerator was out of use from July 9 to July 17. Frank arranged for repairs and ordered parts. In the meantime Jeanne Swain offered us the temporary use of an apartment sized refrigerator, moved by Garth Eckhardt and assisted by Brenda and Pete Wulforst, to our pantry room. Steve Miller came to pick up and store our eggs and other perishables along with our milk in a carnival grounds refrigerator. How fortunate we are to be surrounded with such caring people.

Also, in July with very short notice the dairy providing our milk no longer had funding to donate the 60-90 gallons of whole milk per week they've been providing since April. We are currently purchasing 30 half gallons from our funds each distribution day, at a cost of approximately \$35. If you would like to become a milk sponsor for one of our distribution days, please contact Brenda Wulforst (410-596-5415) or me (410-746-0260).

Food Distributions from June 6 until July 9: Food Bags: 586

Meals (each food bag = meal for family of four): 2,344

Milk: 470 gallons

Eggs: 466 dozen

Produce: 635 units (approximately 3 lb bags, and boxes from Maryland Food Bank - some families offered 2 units)

Meat and Poultry: 524 units (2 frozen boneless chicken breasts, four frozen hamburgers, or pack of hot dogs)

Additional items: cheese, yogurt, snack bags, baked goods, paper products, beverages, sugar, flour, detergent

Food Distributions to Date (March 22 until July 9): Food Bags: 2074

Meals (each food bag = meal for family of four): 8,296

Milk: 1,433 containers

Eggs: 1,408 dozen

Produce: 2,602 units (approximately four tons)

Meat and Poultry: 1,478 units

Additional items: cheese, yogurt, butter, lunch kits, snack bags, baked goods, paper products, beverages, sugar, flour, detergent, cleaning supplies, personal hygiene items.

We continue to be blessed with food and monetary donations to make this ministry possible. Those we serve are grateful for the food they receive. New people often stop by, and lately we've have seen people who haven't been by for quite a while. It's always a joy to reconnect with our brothers and sisters we've come to know. God has put us in a place where we can be His instruments of mercy. Often, we feel like we're stepping aside to get out of God's way as He provides the very things we need. It's a privilege and honor to serve God and our community through this ministry. If you would like to learn more about being a volunteer, contact us. We'd love to have you join our team.

Your church council met Tuesday, July 14, 2020 on a Zoom meeting. The following business was discussed.

OLD BUSINESS

Council Openings:

Brenda Wulforst, Debbie Hebrank, and Rhonda Kiler will be leaving Council at the end of the year. Tyler Mullins will leave council due to absence. This makes 4 openings on Council. The Nominating Committee has one person that has agreed to come on Council.

NEW BUSINESS

Planning Committee:

Frank Burnette suggested to council to consider using the Music and Worship Committee to be part of the Planning Committee. They would be involved anyway with the plan on returning to church. Joe Fleck made a motion to approach members of the Music and Worship Committee and the Executive Committee to form the Planning Committee. This motion was seconded by Brittany Pomales. The motion was unanimously accepted.

Music and Worship and the Executive Committee members will join to look at all the regulations that must be followed to open back up. This includes the State, The Synod, the CDC, and our Insurance Company requirements. The Planning Committee will divide up the segments to research the solutions. The Planning Committee will complete all the segments required to address opening back up. This will include what location is to be used for services, the entrance to be used, what rest rooms are to be available, and what the procedure will be for a service to be held during the COVID crisis.

Questions arose in the council meeting about possible outdoor services. It is important to set a start date to make the congregation aware. Some members are questioning what is going on. The Planning Committee must complete their work before this can be determined.

Groups like AA and Scouts will be notified to return to using the church after we come back. This will help us contain exposure in designated areas only.

Current bathrooms need restocking with paper towels and tissue. They will be cleaned after the supplies are received.

The next church council meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, August 11, 2020 @ 7pm. It will be on Zoom until returning to the church has been decided.
