From The Pastor's Desk....

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I knew that Christmas was going to be very different this year — and difficult. I had no idea just how different and difficult it would turn out to be! As I write this, Christmas Eve is just eight days away and Caroline has been gone for almost three weeks. It's just me and the birds here. I plan to decorate and put up the tree and the lights, but it won't be the same. My daughters, both out of state, may have trouble getting here with COVID travel restrictions. But I do have a sister and a niece and families in Maryland, and I plan to spend some portion of the holidays with them. I mention this because it helps me understand more deeply than ever how difficult Christmas can be for so many who have lost loved ones, and suffered other losses, especially this year when the pandemic has separated us in other ways that interfere with the natural grieving process.

By the time you read this, we will have gathered (those of us who have the necessary technology) for Christmas Eve on Zoom. And most of us will have been left with a longing for past Christmas Eves in the sanctuary, a sense of something missing, and a fervent desire to recover what we have lost when we gather for Christmas 2021. How I look forward to that day! Some things you do get back. Some things you don't. At least not in this life.

So if you found it hard to celebrate this Christmas season, if this was the first Christmas without the one you love more than life, I am with you. Our losses are different. No two losses are the same. But we are on the same journey, and this journey ends in joy. Separation ends in reunion on that day when God will wipe every tear from our eyes, and we will celebrate Christmas together with the Birthday Boy himself!

Finally, let me express my gratitude for the love and support, prayers and cards, and the many acts of kindness you have shown to me and to my family in the past weeks. You have made our journey easier and reminded us that we do not walk this journey alone. Not now. Not ever.

Your church council met Tuesday, December 8, 2020 on a Zoom meeting. The following business was discussed.

Presidents Report:

Council discussed looking into a grant from the Synod to get Chromebooks for those needing access to Zoom meetings. Frank Burnette will apply for the grant.

Connie Dattilo offered her resignation as Vice President at the end of 2020. She will remain on council and finish her two-year term she has left but will not hold any office.

New Business:

There is a need to find Audit Committee members for the church. There is also a need for members to form a Nominating Committee. The current members need volunteers for the committee.

As stated in the Bylaws of the church, council attempted to elect new officers for the 2021 council in December. Nominations for President were asked for. No one was offered to fill the spot. FOOD DISTRIBUTION MINISTRY REPORT

During the four week period November 21 – December 15, our average weekly attendance was 97 individuals and families, compared to 112 the previous 4 weeks. This drop in numbers is partially explained by the amount of food served during this period. As one of the highlights of our days distributing food, we were able to offer 55 turkeys and 55 bags of food to complete a Thanksgiving dinner to those who came to our distribution on Saturday November 21. We had a donation of 24 turkeys through Brenda Meadows of Shepherd's Staff. The rest were purchased through donations or donated directly. On December 2-3 we received 108 cases of food from the Maryland Food Bank, again arranged by Brenda Meadows. Each MFB box contained a gallon of milk, fruit and vegetables, a nearly 3 lb pack of cooked frozen chicken, 2 packs of chicken hot dogs, a block of cheese, and large containers of both yogurt and cottage cheese. It was a large amount of food for us to manage, but with help from the retired firefighters from Manchester Volunteer Fire Company, we were able to store and distribute the cases to our grateful patrons.

From the day we began this ministry on March 21 until December 15 we have distributed 4,270 food bags, the equivalent of 17,080 meals for those in need in our community. We know that we could not maintain this level of food distribution without the partnerships we cherish with those in our church and community.

A grateful mother recently wrote the following letter:


Dear Immanuel Church Family,

At our last LEAD seminar in November, we were challenged to launch an experiment associated with the season of Advent. Pastor Charlie introduced a series, *Deconstructing Advent*, promoted by the LEAD organization and presented at Immanuel during our worship services during Advent. Through video presentations, four modern church leaders invited us to "build by undoing" as we open our eyes to news ways of thinking about both spiritual and social issues. The interactive format involved reflection, confession, and action in response.

The LEAD Team is ready to launch the *Dig Down* process during the month of January. We'll begin with Thinking Theologically through a study of the Book of Philippians, exploring the early church in Philippi. This study will then lead to the analysis of how leadership systems function in our own church and how we might align our governance with God's purpose.

Dig Down also addresses generosity and stewardship. We'll be using resources from both the ELCA and the

DEMD Synod to look at our faith-based giving by casting a vision, telling generosity stories, initiating conversations with potential givers, and expressing gratitude to those who volunteer and those who give.

The final goal of *Dig Down* is to develop an action plan that incorporates changes in how we operate as a church; a plan that reflects a shared vision and clear purpose, aligned with our values and what we perceive as God's plan for our future.

Join us on this spiritual journey. The current LEAD Team is finishing our three year commitment in February. As you can see, there is a lot of work still to be done. Consider becoming a part of Immanuel's future by first praying, reflecting, and engaging in conversation with Pastor Charlie or any current LEAD team member. Among the rewards of being involved with LEAD are both spiritual and personal growth. We invite you to be a part of this important work.

EPIPHANY OF OUR LORD

Even though Immanuel will not be meeting in-person for services in January, the church calendar will continue. During the weekend of January 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} , the Feast of the Epiphany is observed.

The word 'Epiphany' means the manifestation or the showing of the Christ Child and concludes the Christmas season with a celebration of God's glory revealed in the person of baby Jesus. In the book of Matthew, it is written that when the wise men saw a brilliant star shining in the eastern sky, this star appeared to stop overhead and pointed the way. These three 'magi' traveled a long distance to see the Christ Child. They were welcomed by Mary and Joseph into a small humble stable – their temporary home...

"Upon entering the house, they saw the child with Mary, his mother." (taken from Matthew 2: 1-12)

Following an Eastern European tradition, there was a visual blessing that was used and inscribed in chalk over the main door of a family dwelling. For example: 20+CMB+21 translated this means: the numbers (20,21) represent our current year, 2021; the three letters (CMB) refer to the names of the three wise men, Casper \sim Melchior \sim and Balthasar.

THE BAPTISM OF OUR LORD

During the weekend of January 9th and 10th, the Baptism of Our Lord is observed. It is said, that in the River Jordan, Jesus was baptized and revealed as the Son of God. Jesus fulfilled all promises and became the servant of God, who would bring justice and the light to all nations. During our baptisms, we were washed clean by the Word, anointed by the Spirit and name one of God's beloved children and members of His body, the church.
