# From The Pastor's Desk....

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Last month, I ended my newsletter article with these words: "May God hold us together while we are apart, and hasten the day when can safely gather as the people of Immanuel once again!" We are now moving closer to that day.

MISSION STATEMENT

Our Mission, as disciples of Jesus, is to commit ourselves to making Christ known through worship, service, outreach, learning and loving one another. When June arrives, we will have been worshiping online for ten weeks. I still cannot say for sure when we will gather again in our sanctuary, but we have moved one step closer with the Governor's decision to enter Phase 1 of his re-opening plan. Congregations now may resume in person worship services, either outside (preferred) or in their sanctuaries at no more than 50% of regular seating capacity *with necessary safety precautions in place*. We are not yet ready to open our sanctuary because we need time to prepare everything needed to open safely. Here are the requirements we must meet:

\*A seating arrangement assuring at least 7 feet of separation between groups of worshipers (families who live together at home may sit together in worship).

- \*Admitting only those wearing face masks and who are free from fever and other signs of infection. Those with underlying health problems or over age 65 are strongly discouraged from attending (our pastor and organist are in this group), as are small children unable to maintain required social distancing.
- \*Accurate attendance records must be kept for contact tracing should any worshiper later test positive for COVID-19.
- \*All surfaces in the worship area, restrooms, hallways and entryways must be disinfected before and after each service. This includes hymnals and anything else in the pews. There must be no direct or indirect physical contact such as handing out bulletins, passing offering plates, or sharing Communion. Hand sanitizer must be readily available to all worshipers.

\*Because the virus can spread quickly through droplets in the air released when a person speaks and especially when a person sings (even when wearing a face mask), the singing of hymns and congregational responses is out. Spoken responses (the prayers, Peace, Creed and Lord's Prayer) are safe if spoken quietly. A distance of at least 20 feet from others is required for anyone singing or projecting their voice as a worship leader. This means no choir.

All the above things need to be in place with well-trained volunteers ready the first time we open our doors. Failure to observe any of these restrictions could be deadly. Even if we carefully observe them all, there is still a slight risk of unknowingly spreading the coronavirus through our worship. During a pandemic, risk cannot be eliminated, just reduced. Before we resume in person worship, our plan must be reviewed and approved by our insurance carrier, Church Mutual. One congregation in our synod had their insurance coverage dropped for failing to practice risk reduction! The final decision to resume worship in the sanctuary will be made by our Congregation Council.

# FEEDING MINISTRY REPORT JUNE 2020

In 2019, the LEAD Team spent much of the summer and fall listening to members of the community, as we discussed the strengths of Manchester, our community needs, and how together we might address them. We never could have imagined then what 2020 had in store for us as a world, nation, and community. Many of the people we listened to became supporters of our feeding ministry during this pandemic: Tree of Friends, Manchester Town Government, Manchester Volunteer Fire Department, Manchester House, North Carroll Recreation Council (Hotshots Softball), the Lineboro-Manchester Lions Club, North Carroll Middle School, and Manchester Valley High School. They were joined by other businesses and organizations in and near our community such as Manchester Baptist Church, Trinity UCC, First Fruits Farm, Miller's Market, Weis Market, Kenny's Market, La Jarochita, Walgreen's Westminster, and Bertucco's Bakery. When you add in the many individuals and families who have contributed food and money to our ministry, we can only stand in awe of the work of God and the generosity of this community to make this ministry not only possible, but growing and thriving in new ways every week.

As of this writing, we have completed week 8 of our drive by/walk up feeding ministry. We are in the parking lot of Immanuel by the Little Free Pantry every Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday from 10am until noon. To date, we have given out 1,093 bags of groceries, 645 containers of milk, and 588 cartons of eggs. We've also distributed apples, produce, chicken, yogurt, butter, coffee, cheese, snacks, breads and bakery items, snack bags, and paper products.

The most important aspect of this ministry is the relationships we've formed with the people we serve. Young families, seniors, veterans, those who have lost their jobs or had their work hours reduced – struggling and unsure of the future. We're there to feed them and their families, reassuring them that we care and that God's love is present through our ministry.

It takes a lot of workers to manage the pantry, organize food donations, bag food, set up our distribution site, distribute food, break down and put away items at the end of the session, pick up and bring donations to the church, and track donations. Brenda and Pete Wulforst and I work with 24 regular volunteers from our church and the community. If you'd like to be part of this ministry, please contact Brenda or me and we will add you to our list of volunteers.

As 10am approaches each distribution day, we take a deep breath, look over the bounty of food we have for distribution, and offer a prayer of thanks to God for those who provided the food and those who are in line to accept it. Thanks be to God for the abundance he has provided through the caring people of our community!

#### **ELCA Youth Gathering Overview**

Every three years, 30,000 high school youth and their adult leaders from across the ELCA gather together for a week of faith formation. Through days spent in interactive learning, worship, Bible study, service and fellowship, young people grow in faith and are challenged and inspired to live their faith in their daily lives.



**EXAMPLE 1** The theme of the 2021 Gathering is *"boundless: God beyond measure,"* based on Ephesians 3:19. "I want you to know all about Christ's love, although it is too wonderful to be measured. Then your lives will be filled with all that God is."

#### The next event is *June 29—July 3, 2021* in Minneapolis, MN

Just as we did in 2018, Immanuel and St Paul's Church are working together to attend the Youth Gathering. We are excited to already have 13 kids and at least four adults going to MN.

<u>Immanuel's monthly mission for June is the ELCA Youth Gathering</u>. The special offering collected will supplement the fund raising efforts. Although we have been working since we returned from the youth gathering in Houston in 2018, more support is still needed to cover the estimated costs of \$1,000 per person to attend.

#### NEW BUSINESS

At the current time, we have one group of youth that we have not ministered to, Kindergarten and elementary children. As I write this the Governor has introduced Phase 1 of Maryland's recovery plan. As a result, we are allowed to participate in outdoor religious activities. The Christian Ed team is working on an outdoor activity and we will let you know of future plans.

We are currently discussing how to implement VBS at Immanuel in 2020. This is a new ballgame since we will probably utilize ZOOM and will not be able to gather in the church. Additional information will be sent out soon.
