From The Pastor's Desk....

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

During most of May, we have enjoyed worshipping in-person and sharing Holy Communion in a beautiful natural setting at Thomas Tree Farm. We anticipate returning to in-person worship in our sanctuary beginning Sunday, June 6th, following the next Planning Committee meeting on June 1st. We will announce the starting date and the full worship schedule once the committee has met.

We have been on quite a journey these past 14 months. When the pandemic hit, we adapted almost immediately, becoming an online church and developing a food distribution ministry with many neighborhood partners that continues to serve all who come for help. Although the pandemic is not over yet, we can begin to look beyond it and wonder what God has in mind for us in the months and years ahead. Here are some questions for us to consider and hold in prayer.

- *Will we continue to offer online worship and Bible study once we can all gather safely in person?
- *How will we build on the new neighborhood partnerships that have developed since we started our food distribution ministry? What new ways of reaching out with our neighbors to serve those in need may grow from this?
- *Once we all can gather without masks or distancing, how will we come together to rebuild and deepen our sense of community?
- *How will we seek to draw others into God's family at Immanuel?
- *In a world that has become increasingly fractured by personal and political differences during this pandemic, how will we seek to mend what is broken and work toward peace and reconciliation in our congregation, our communities and beyond?
- *What questions come to your mind as you look toward your future and the future of Immanuel?

The task before us may be daunting, but we can trust Jesus' promise to be with us through all of it. The God who has brought us this far will bring us the rest of the way. "Remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20)

FOOD DISTRIBUTION MINISTRY REPORT

Our food distribution ministry is still robust, uplifted by our church members, community partners, faithful volunteers, and generous food and money donations. In the past month, however, we've seen the numbers drop.

During the four week period April 17-May 11, we averaged 78 guests per week. During the previous four weeks, our average weekly attendance was 92 guests. Compared to last year when we fed 157 people the first week of May 2020, it seems evident that the people we have served are finding work, returning to their jobs, or otherwise finding themselves in a better place for the long term. We seem to see fewer people in need of emergency food supplies directly related to COVID-19, however the hardships in our community that we hear about are often heartbreaking stories.

Our leadership team members Brenda and Pete Wulforst, Rachel Murphy, Carol Miller, and I will be meeting Tuesday May 18. We will be discussing and updating our current policies and procedures, especially in light of the recent recommendations by the CDC and Governor Hogan.

On May 1, we returned to the side of the education building to distribute food, where shade and breeze can keep our food fresher and volunteers can be protected from the heat.

We have heard no updates from Tree of Friends Foundation about their search for a new location. We continue to apply for \$500 per month grants from the Community Foundation of Carroll County, directed to us by ToFF.

As always, we are thankful to God that He has richly blessed this ministry. May the people whom we continue to serve experience God's strength and comfort during these difficult times.

- *Property scheduled the spring maintenance for shutting down the boiler and getting the air conditioning ready to go.
- *We are working on the 3 areas needing work after the boiler inspection. We have our HVAC contractor doing two items and Tim Kyle, electrician will do the third. While at church, he will also look at the lights in the old library room and the blue room used by the Food Pantry. The lights have bulb and connection issues.
- *Property brought the trailer of mulch on Friday May 14th so the youth group weeded and mulched around the church. This is mulch that Wayne Thomas donated to the group.
- *Arbor Care met with property at the church on May 25th. They looked at the Oak Tree and advised on the current condition of the tree. On-going maintenance of the tree will be discussed and a contract reviewed.
