## From The Pastor's Desk....

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Most of what I shared with you last month remains the same. We are worshiping online every Saturday at 5 PM and now every Sunday at 9 AM. We have moved our outdoor Sunday service at the Thomas Tree Farm to 11 AM, a time better suited to these chilly mornings. Our Worship & Music and Executive Committee joint planning group has set Sunday, Oct. 18 as the target date to move in-person worship back inside. We are still considering which space will be most COVID-safe. Our Scout troop and Cub Scout pack are currently meeting every week at Christmas Tree Park while weather permits. They are eager to be back inside as soon as can be done safely, as are our AA groups. Once again, a few volunteers from Shepherd's Staff are using the Scout room to decorate Christmas trees for their annual fundraiser.

We are still a resilient congregation, although as the pandemic continues the stress is taking its toll. There is strong disagreement over how we are managing the reopening process. Tempers have flared. We need to find a way to work through our disagreements in a spirit of Christian love: listening to each other, seeking God's will together, sharing our opinions while respectfully considering the opinions of others. It's a bit long, but let me share this passage from Ephesians 4:25-5:1.

So then, putting away falsehood, let all of us speak the truth to our neighbors, for we are members of one another. Be angry but do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, and do not make room for the devil... Let no evil talk come out of your mouths, but only what is useful for building up, as there is need, so that your words may give grace to those who hear. And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with which you were marked with a seal for the day of redemption. Put away from you all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with all malice, and be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you.

Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

If we all do our best to apply these words to our lives with God's help, Immanuel Church will emerge from this time of testing stronger, more loving and more resilient than ever!

Your church council met Tuesday, September 8, 2020 on a Zoom meeting. The following business was discussed.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

Council was advised that the church doors have been unlocked several times. Lights have also been left on. Everyone using the church was asked to please check the doors and lights as they leave the building. A question arose about looking into motion sensor controls on the lights in high traffic areas.

#### SUNDAY SCHOOL

Sunday school, at the present time is at a stand-still. Ms. Jeanne prepares lessons/activities for families to take home after the Sunday service. When we are able to return to the church property, we will revisit formal Sunday school.

During the in person and zoom worship services September 19 and 20, the LEAD team gave an update to the congregation about what we've been working on in the past months and what projects we'll be focusing on next. LEAD has been busy in 2020 in spite of the pandemic. We've been meeting at three-week intervals via zoom since February. In late 2019 and into 2020 the LEAD team spent time discerning with the congregation what makes us unique as a church – an identity statement (not a mission or vision statement) that describes Immanuel's values. We began by conducting small group exercises, drafted a statement, asked for feedback, and after considering comments from thirty people from our church and community, we recently adopted this core values statement:

We are God's family on a journey of love with Jesus, rich in history and tradition yet open to the Spirit, welcoming all in worship and learning, growing in faith as the Spirit leads us, reaching out with our neighbors to serve those in need, sharing with others God's all-embracing love,

We invite you to walk with us on this journey.

Pastor Charlie speaks these words to us at each zoom and in person worship service as part of the sending liturgy at the end of the service. It's a way to embrace the values we believe in as we are sent forth to serve. You'll be seeing it on our website, as a statement of who we are to both remind our members and inform visitors who want to know about our church. The LEAD team will be using this statement when looking at our practices as a church to determine how our values and practices align. Do some of the things we do need to be adjusted so that our church activities truly reflect who we say we are? Are there new ways we can act out our values? We'll be asking for your feedback as we go through this process.

Our food distribution, a community partnership born in March 2020 through LEAD's Listening in the Neighborhood and Immanuel's Little Free Pantry, continues to thrive. We are extremely grateful for the congregation's support through volunteer hours and generous food and monetary donations. Still, are there other ways we can partner with our neighbors to serve those in need? Earlier in our LEAD journey, some of you mentioned the need for transportation, affordable housing, and a central referral source in town. Is God calling you get something started in one of these areas, or with another community need? We'd love to hear from you!

After a full day online LEAD learning seminar on September 12, Immanuel's LEAD team is moving forward to tackle other challenges. Pastor Charlie is continuing to incorporate contemporary music into our worship services. The LEAD team will be addressing generosity practices, as together we learn *to* celebrate God's grace by abundantly sharing our blessings and gifts. We'll be working as a congregation to go deeper in our faith by exploring new ways to grow spiritually, individually and in small groups. Pastor Charlie will be introducing faith practices we can use in our everyday life. We'll be working to develop a relationship with church council that we hope will be of benefit to our church's future.

We, as a LEAD Team, cannot do this alone. We invite you to walk with us on this journey.

#### FOOD DISTRIBUTION REPORT OCTOBER 2020

As our food distribution continues beyond what we could have ever imagined God had planned for us, we met two milestones this past week. We hit the 26<sup>th</sup> week mark of this ministry on September 15, meaning that we've been organizing, packing and distributing food for half a year. On September 19 we surpassed a cumulative total of 3,000 food bags, the equivalent of 12,000 meals for our community. We thank God for our community partners and generous individuals in our congregation and community who keep this ministry going.


At this point we have not heard of any plans from Tree of Friends regarding their reopening. We continue to be steadfast in our commitment to provide food for those in need and hope to work cooperatively with ToFF when they open their doors again.

Two upcoming changes will impact how we operate. As the weather turns cold, it will be a challenge to distribute food in wintery conditions. Again, we are trying to think ahead and come up with guidelines that will keep us serving the food in a safe way for both our visitors and workers.

September has also been a time of recommitment among our volunteers: to stay anchored to our mission and to pray together every distribution day. We invite you to stop by any Tuesday or Saturday 10am until noon to witness the impact of this ministry. We also ask that you keep us, and especially the people we serve, in your prayers.
